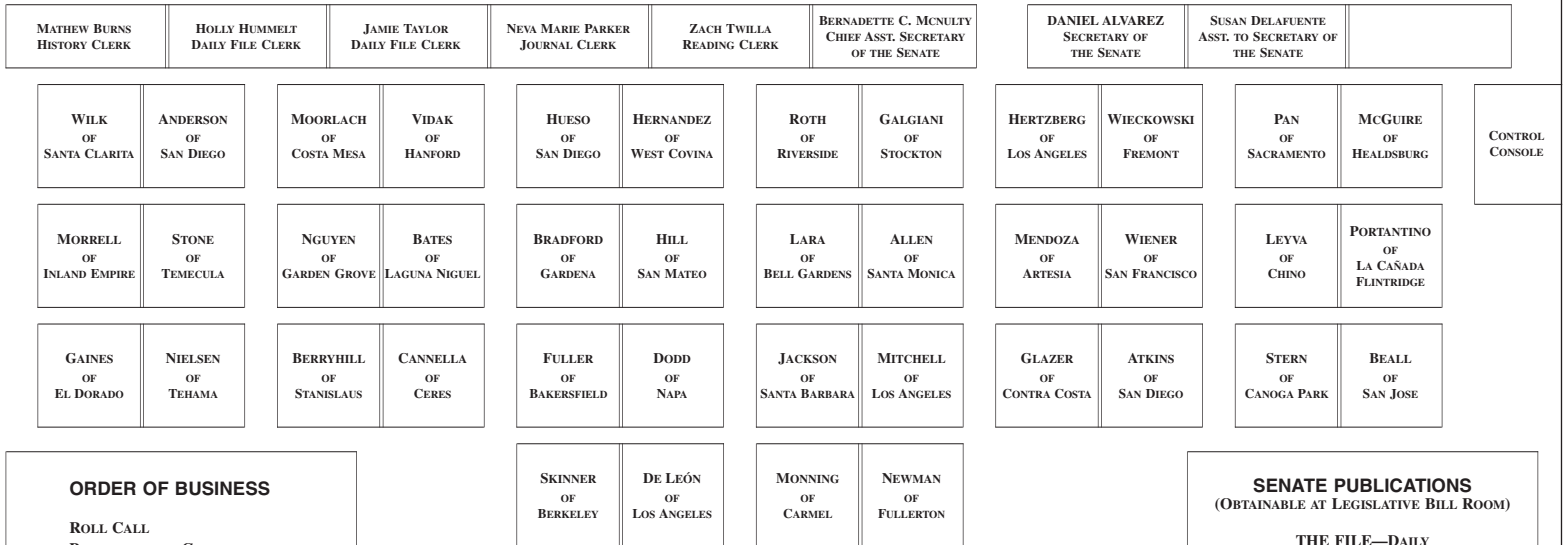

The Department is beginning a rulemaking process on the Lake and Streambed Alteration Program and the bill, as currently written, is premature.

I am directing the Department to update its website to reflect the new guidance, once the regulations are complete.

I am returning Senate Bill 644 without my signature.

This bill authorizes a court to impound a boat for up to 30 days in boating under the influence cases if the owner is convicted and the conduct resulted in the unlawful killing of a person.

Boating under the influence is a very troubling crime which exposes the public to grave danger. However, especially in cases where this conduct resulted in an unlawful killing, a defendant will be exposed to very serious criminal and civil liability, including potentially years in prison depending on the circumstances. I do not see the need, in these tragic but narrow instances, to additionally expand the powers of government to impound private property as an added punitive measure.

Because this bill will not act as a deterrent, and existing criminal and civil penalties are sufficient to address the conduct contemplated, I am returning this measure without my signature.

The Assembly amendments would instead authorize, until January 1, 2022, a licensee under the act to provide any of the authorized interdisciplinary hospice services, including palliative care, to a patient who has a serious illness and would require a licensee who elects to provide palliative care pursuant to this temporary authorization to report additional specified information to the State Department of Public Health, including the number of patients receiving palliative care. The Assembly amendments would require the department, on or before June 1, 2021, to convene a stakeholder meeting to discuss the results of the information collected pursuant to these provisions.

The Assembly amendments, instead, require a licensed health care practitioner who performs a stem cell therapy that is not approved by the United States Food and Drug Administration to communicate to his or her patient seeking stem cell therapy specified information regarding the provision of stem cell therapies on a specified notice displayed prominently in an area visible to patients in his or her office, posted conspicuously in the entrance of his or her office, and provided to the patient in writing, as specified. The Assembly amendments also authorize the licensing board having jurisdiction of the health care practitioner to cite and fine the health care practitioner for a violation of these provisions. The Assembly amendments also require the Medical Board of California, beginning with its 2018–19 annual report, to indicate specific enforcement information with regard to its licensees who provide stem cell therapies.

SB 138, as it passed the Senate, required a local educational agency participating in a federal school meal program to use that participation data, commencing with the participation data of pupils in the 2017–18 school year, to directly certify pupils eligible for free and reduced-price school meals, to the extent permitted under federal law.

The Assembly amendments authorize the department to share that participation data instead with local educational agencies, and impose specified requirements on the State Department of Education and local educational agencies relating to the privacy and confidentiality of that participation data. The Assembly amendments authorize a school district or county superintendent of schools to determine a pupil’s eligibility for free and reduced-price school meals based on data including the direct certification match and alternative measures of poverty pursuant to specified state and federal law.

The Assembly amendments, on or before September 1, 2018, require a school district or county superintendent of schools that has a very high poverty school, as defined, in its jurisdiction, and a charter school that is a very high poverty school, as specified, to apply to operate a federal universal meal service provision pursuant to specified federal law, and to begin providing breakfast and lunch free of charge through the universal meal service to all pupils at the very high poverty school upon state approval to operate that service. The Assembly amendments provide a specified exemption to these provisions, and authorize a school district, county superintendent of schools, or charter school to stop providing the universal free meal service at a school if the school ceases to be a very high poverty school.

The Assembly amendments also add a coauthor and a principal coauthor and make other nonsubstantive changes.

SB 189 also expanded the scope of the exception to apply to an owner of a professional corporation, as defined, who is a practitioner rendering the professional services for which the professional corporation is organized, and who executes a written waiver of his or her rights under the laws governing workers' compensation, stating under penalty of perjury that he or she is covered by a health insurance policy or a health care service plan.

The Assembly amendments revise the criteria for the expanded exception to apply to an officer or member of the board of directors of a quasi-public or private corporation who owns at least 10% of the issued and outstanding stock, or 1% of the issued and outstanding stock of the corporation if that officer's or member's parent, grandparent, sibling, spouse, or child owns at least 10% of the issued and outstanding stock of the corporation and that officer or member is covered by a health care service plan or a health insurance policy. The Assembly amendments also expand the scope of the exception to include an officer or member of the board of directors of a cooperative corporation. The Assembly amendments expand the definition of an employee to specifically include a person who holds the power to revoke a trust, with respect to shares of a private corporation held in trust or general partnership or limited liability company interests held in trust, and authorize that person to elect to be excluded from the requirement to obtain workers' compensation coverage. The Assembly amendments provide that an insurance carrier, insurance agent, or insurance broker is not required to investigate, verify, or confirm the accuracy of the facts contained in the waiver, and make other changes relating to the execution and acceptance of waivers. The Assembly amendments also make the changes made by the bill effective on July 1, 2018, except as specified.

SB 229, as it passed the Senate, also prohibited a accessory dwelling unit from being considered by a local agency, special district, or water corporation to be a new residential use for purposes of calculating connection fees or capacity changes for utilities.

The Assembly amendments, in addition, require the local agency ordinance to authorize accessory dwelling unit parking spaces to be provided as tandem parking on a driveway and require (1) a lot to be zoned to allow single-family or multifamily use and include either a proposed or existing single-family dwelling, (2) the accessory dwelling unit to be either attached to, or located within the living area of, either the proposed or existing primary dwelling, or detached from the proposed or existing primary dwelling but located on the same lot, and (3) the total area of floor space of an attached accessory dwelling unit to not exceed 50% of the proposed or existing primary dwelling living area or 1,200 square feet. The Assembly amendments also prohibit a local agency from imposing parking standards for an accessory dwelling unit when the accessory dwelling unit is part of either the proposed or existing primary residence or an accessory structure.

The Assembly amendments delete the word “initial” from the boundary establishment provision. The Assembly amendments delete the above-described provision authorizing the agency’s boundaries to be changed and instead authorize the agency’s boundaries to be changed upon completion of a change of organization or a reorganization to the Central California Irrigation District or the Firebaugh Canal Water District, as specified, or upon a proposal for a change of organization or reorganization initiated by the adoption of a resolution of application by the board of directors of the agency and approval of the proposal by the local agency formation commission, as specified. The Assembly amendments, among other things, authorize a transitional housing placement provider, defined as an organization licensed by the State Department of Social Services to provide transitional housing to foster children at least 16 years of age to promote their transition to adulthood, to operate either as a “Transitional Housing Placement program for minor foster children,” a program serving foster children at least 16 years of age and not more than 18 years of age, or as a “Transitional Housing Placement program for nonminor dependents,” a program serving nonminor dependents at least 18 years of age and not more than 21 years of age.

The Assembly amendments additionally provide that transitional housing units include a host family certified by a transitional housing placement provider with whom a participant lives, as provided, a staffed site in which the participant lives, as provided, and a remote site in which the participant lives independently, as provided. The bill authorizes a transitional housing placement provider to cosign a lease with a nonminor dependent, as specified by the department.

The Assembly amendments incorporate amendments to Section 1502 of the Health and Safety Code proposed by AB 501 and Sections 11400, 11402, and 11403.3 of the Welfare and Institutions Code proposed by AB 404 that would become operative if this bill and the bills amending the affected sections are chaptered, as specified.
