The Assembly amendments restore and reorganize the repealed provision described above and make it applicable to matters involving more than one violation of human trafficking, pimping, or pandering in more than one jurisdictional territory.

**Legislative Counsel’s Digest of Assembly Amendments**

SB 1462, as it passed the Senate, was a local government omnibus bill that, among other things, authorized real property acquired by the board of law library trustees to be leased, rented, or licensed, with the proceeds to be deposited in the law library fund. The bill authorized a legislative body, as defined, to include the maturity or maturities of bonds in the ordinance, resolution, indenture, agreement, or other instrument providing for issuance. The bill also specified that the description of the boundaries of a proposed infrastructure financing district included in the resolution of intention to establish the district may be accomplished by reference to a map on file in the office of the clerk of either the city or county that is proposing to establish the district.

The Assembly amendments authorize the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors to designate, by resolution, another county officer to perform the duties of the county clerk with respect to the filing of a fictitious business name statement. The amendments correct an erroneous cross-reference in a provision requiring the Controller to regularly audit the annual apportionment and allocation by counties of property tax revenues. The amendments extend, from December 31, 2014, to December 31, 2019, the authorization for special districts to issue securitized limited obligation notes. The amendments eliminate the requirement that the noise element recognize the guidelines established by the Office of Noise Control. The amendments correct an erroneous cross-reference in the definition of “port or harbor infrastructure” for purposes of provisions relating to the establishment of an infrastructure fund and financing port or harbor infrastructure. The amendments also make various changes to the Property and Business Improvement District Law of 1994, including revising the definition of “assessment” for purposes of that law to mean a levy for the purpose of providing activities that will benefit the properties or businesses located within the district. The amendments authorize the description in the resolution of intention to form a district, the management district plan, and the resolution of formation of the district to be made by reference to any plan or map that is on file with the city clerk. The amendments correct an erroneous cross-reference in the listing of the information required to be contained in the resolution establishing a property and business improvement district. The amendments authorize a property and business improvement district, upon the expiration of the district, to be renewed, and authorize the renewal of any district whose term will expire. The amendments eliminate the requirement that all delinquent payments for assessments be charged interest and penalties, and instead authorize interest and penalties to be charged for delinquent payments. The amendments eliminate the reference to “public meetings” and change any reference from “public

meeting” to “public hearing” in the provision relating to public hearings on the modification of a management district plan. The amendments also require the report, required to be prepared by the owners’ association under contract with the local governmental entity to administer or implement activities and improvements specified in the management district plan for each fiscal year for which assessments are to be levied and collected, to include the estimated amount of any surplus or deficit revenues to be carried over from a previous fiscal year and the estimated amount of any contributions to be made from sources other than assessments.

SB 1037, as it passed the Senate, also required the MTA to include the updated expenditure plan in the Long Range Transportation Plan and required the updated Long Range Transportation Plan to include the capital projects and capital programs that are adopted by each subregion and that are submitted to the MTA for inclusion in the Long Range Transportation Plan.

The Assembly amendments additionally require, at least 30 days before submitting the ordinance described above to the voters, the MTA to post the amended expenditure plan and the Long Range Transportation Plan on the MTA’s Internet Web site in a prominent manner. The Assembly amendments also make nonsubstantive changes to the bill’s provisions.

The Assembly amendments instead authorize a judge of the juvenile court to dismiss a petition, or to set aside the findings and dismiss the petition, if the court finds that the interests of justice and the welfare of the person who is the subject of the petition require that dismissal, or if it finds that he or she is not in need of treatment or rehabilitation, regardless of whether the person who is the subject of the petition is, at the time of the order, a ward or dependent child of the court. The amendments also provide that the court is not required to maintain jurisdiction over a person who is the subject of a petition between the time the court’s jurisdiction over that person terminates and the point at which his or her petition is dismissed.
