S.B. No. 533—Pan.

An act relating to local government.

Legislative Counsel's Digest of Assembly Amendments

SB 533, as it passed the Senate, prohibited, on or after January 1, 2016, a local agency from entering into any form of agreement that would result, directly or indirectly, in the payment, transfer, diversion, or rebate of Bradley–Burns local sales and use tax revenues (Bradley–Burns tax revenue) to any person, for any purpose, if the agreement results in a reduction in the amount of Bradley–Burns tax revenues that, in the absence of the agreement, would be received by another local agency and the retailer continues to maintain a physical presence within the territorial jurisdiction of that other local agency, with specified exceptions. SB 533, as it passed the Senate, imposed specified notification and reporting requirements on a local agency entering into an agreement that results in a reduction of the amount of Bradley–Burns tax revenues, that in the absence of the agreement, would be received by another local agency, prior to the ratification of that agreement. SB 533 also required any local agency to post such an agreement on its Internet Web site, including any agreements entered into prior to January 1, 2016, that are still in effect.

The Assembly amendments exclude from that prohibition and those requirements any mutual tax revenue sharing agreement between local agencies to pay, transfer, or divert Bradley–Burns tax revenues to another local agency, and where the agreement would not result, directly or indirectly, in the payment, transfer, diversion, or rebate of those tax revenues to a retailer.

S.B. No. 542—Mendoza.

An act relating to workers' compensation.

Legislative Counsel's Digest of Assembly Amendments

SB 542, as it passed the Senate, authorized, rather than required, the official medical fee schedule adopted for purposes of workers' compensation provisions to be based on either the maximum service hours and fees set forth in provisions of state law governing in-home supportive services or other state or federal home health care services fee schedules.

The Assembly amendments additionally require, commencing January 1, 2016, every medical provider network to post on its Internet Web site information about how to contact the medical provider network contact and medical access assistants and how to obtain a copy of the complete employee notification. The Assembly amendments also provide that, commencing January 1, 2016, a modification that updates an entire medical provider network plan to bring the plan into full compliance with all current statutes and regulations shall be deemed approved for a period of four years from the modification approval date. The Assembly amendments also require medical provider networks, rather than an insurer, employer, or entity that provides physician network services that arrange for care for injured employees through a medical provider network, to file continuity of care policies, among other duties. The Assembly amendments also require an employer or its claims administrator, rather than an insurer, employer, or entity that provides physician network services, to provide for the completion of treatment by a terminated provider under specified circumstances. The Assembly amendments also define an "entity that provides physician network services" for the purposes described above to mean a medical network licensed by a designated government department or a legal entity that offers medical management and physician network services within California.

S.B. No. 147—Hernandez.

An act relating to Medi-Cal.

Legislative Counsel's Digest of Assembly Amendments

SB 147, as it passed the Senate, required the State Department of Health Care Services to authorize a 3-year alternative payment method (APM) pilot project for federally qualified health centers (FQHCs) that agree to participate. The pilot project provided that participating FQHCs would receive a per member per month wrap cap payment for each of its APM enrollees and required each principal health plan to pay a participating FQHC that is in the plan provider network the wrap-cap amounts, as determined, for each APM enrollee of that FQHC. The bill defined various terms for purposes of the pilot project. The bill also required that an independent entity complete an evaluation of the pilot project and report its findings to the department and the Legislature.

The Assembly amendments revise these provisions to instead require the department to authorize implementation of an APM pilot project with respect to a county for a period of up to 3 years, and require the department to authorize a payment reform pilot project, rather than a 3-year payment reform pilot project. The Assembly amendments eliminate the wrap cap payments, require the department to notify a principal health plan in writing of the principal health plan's specific APM supplemental capitation rate for the participating FQHC in the county, revise the definitions of various terms for purposes of the pilot project, and require that the evaluation by the independent entity also identify any administrative and financial implementation issues for FQHCs that may arise if subsequent legislation makes the pilot program operative statewide. The Assembly amendments make other changes relating to the payment methodology. The Assembly amendments require the department to seek any federal approvals necessary to implement these provisions. The Assembly amendments also provide that nothing in these provisions shall be deemed to affect the amounts paid or the reimbursement methodology applicable to FQHCs for dental services that are provided outside the scope of a contract between the department and an applicable principal health plan that is in effect as of July 1, 2015. The Assembly amendments require the department to provide a status report to the Legislature on a semiannual basis beginning January 1, 2017, until 6 months after implementation of the pilot project.

S.B. No. 197—Block.

An act relating to finance lenders.

Legislative Counsel's Digest of Assembly Amendments

SB 197, as it passed the Senate, authorized a licensed finance lender, pursuant to the California Finance Lenders Law, to compensate an unlicensed person or company in connection with the referral of one or more prospective borrowers to the licensee for a commercial loan if certain requirements are met, including, but not limited to, a requirement that the annual percentage rate of the loan not exceed 36%. SB 197 also required a licensed finance lender who receives an application for a commercial loan from a prospective borrower who has been referred by an unlicensed person or company to provide a specified statement to the borrower regarding the referral arrangement.

The Assembly amendments instead require the loan contract to provide for an annual percentage rate not exceeding 36%. The Assembly amendments additionally impose liability for any misrepresentation to a borrower in connection with a commercial loan on a licensee that pays referral compensation to an unlicensed person for that loan, require the licensee to maintain records of all referral compensation paid to unlicensed persons for at least 4 years, and allow an unlicensed person authorized to be compensated by this measure to engage in specified acts in connection with the loan if the person meets certain criteria. The Assembly amendments authorize the Commissioner of Business Oversight to adopt regulations imposing conditions on this referral activity, as specified, and provide a definition for "referral." The Assembly amendments also prohibit any unlicensed person receiving referral compensation from engaging in specified acts and authorize the commissioner to order this person to desist and refrain from engaging in the business or further violating those provisions governing such referral.

The Assembly amendments require nonprofit organizations that pay for such travel to disclose only the names of donors who, in the preceding year, both donated to the nonprofit organization and accompanied an elected officer or officeholder for any portion of the travel, as specified. The Assembly amendments also incorporate provisions to prevent this bill from chaptering out additional changes made by AB 10.

SB 696, as it passed the Senate, among other things, required the Insurance Commissioner and insurers engaging in specified activities relating to the business of life insurance to incorporate the methodology employed by a specified manual of valuation instructions adopted by the National Association of Insurance Commissioners in making determinations relating to reserve requirements and the minimum standard of valuation for policies and contracts, as specified; required a company to establish reserves using a principle-based valuation that meets specified conditions in that manual; and required the company to develop and file with the commissioner, upon request, a principle-based valuation report. SB 696 required the commissioner to impose an annual assessment on each insurer, based on the insurer’s gross annual life insurance premium, written in California during the immediately preceding year, thereby imposing a tax. SB 696 also exempted certain information submitted to the commissioner from an insurer from disclosure pursuant to the California Public Records Act; provided that the specified information is not subject to subpoena or discovery or admissible in evidence in any private civil action; and authorized the commissioner to hire and assign department staff, and retain nondepartmental actuaries and other consultants, to assist in implementing principle-based valuation.

The Assembly amendments, among other things, change the requirement that the commissioner impose an annual assessment to an authorization to do so; prohibit the valuation manual from being operative until the commissioner certifies that adequate funding has been appropriated by the Legislature and all other necessary resources are available and sufficient to enable the commissioner to carry out his or her duties under these provisions; and require that the commissioner publish a notice, as provided, that the valuation manual is in effect. The amendments also create the Office of Principle-Based Reserving within the Department of Insurance, authorize the commissioner to select, for the Governor’s appointment, the head of the office, and make the position a civil service exempt gubernatorial appointment.

The bill added to that list, the misdemeanor offenses of committing the above described offense, petty theft of a firearm, and convictions on or after January 1, 2016, for transferring a handgun without a firearm dealer license, selling or giving possession of ammunition to a minor, possession of ammunition by a person prohibited from possessing a firearm, furnishing ammunition to a person prohibited from possessing ammunition, carrying ammunition onto school grounds, receiving stolen property consisting of a firearm, and carrying a loaded or a concealed weapon if the person has been previously convicted of a crime against the person or against property, or of a narcotics or dangerous drug violation, or if the firearm was not registered. The bill made additional technical, nonsubstantive changes to provisions prohibiting the sale, lease, or transfer of firearms by a person not licensed as a firearms dealer.

The Assembly amendments delete from the list of misdemeanors described above most of the misdemeanor offenses, retaining only the misdemeanor offenses of petty theft of a firearm, and for convictions on or after January 1, 2016, for receiving stolen property consisting of a firearm and carrying ammunition onto school grounds. The amendments also delete the nonsubstantive changes to the provisions prohibiting the sale, lease, or transfer of firearms by a person not licensed as a firearms dealer. The amendments make additional technical, nonsubstantive changes.
