**Proclamation by Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger
2009–10
FIFTH EXTRAORDINARY SESSION
(Convened August 27, 2009)**

WHEREAS, an extraordinary occasion has arisen and now exists requiring that the Legislature of the State of California be convened in extraordinary session.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ARNOLD SCHWARZENEGGER, Governor of the State of California, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by Article IV, Section 3(b) of the Constitution of the State of California, do hereby convene the Legislature of the State of California to meet in extraordinary session at Sacramento, California on the 20th day of August, 2009, at a time to be determined, for the following purpose and to legislate upon the following subject no later than October 5, 2009:

1. To consider and act upon legislation to address the federal Race to the Top eligibility requirements and guidelines, and other changes necessary to secure federal funding.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of California to be affixed this 20th day of August, 2009.
